Alongside 27 Secondary Schools in Singapore, we are in the third year of our FSBB journey with our 2022 Secondary 1 intake of students. FSBB students can take subjects at different academic levels (G1, G2, and G3), which are mapped from the Normal (Technical), Normal (Academic) and Express standards respectively, based on their strengths. This empowers students to further develop their strengths in subjects in which they have performed well at the Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE). Mixed class groupings encourage students to forge wider friendship circles and a stronger culture of peer support. The number of SBB students in the NA and NT courses are as shown below:

8. Strategic Thrusts (ST)

ST1: Empowering Learning

- 8.1 Our students performed well in the 2021 GCE 'N' Level examination: 16.7% qualified for the Polytechnic Foundation Programme; 72.7% qualified for the Direct Entry to Polytechnic Programme; and 74.2% qualified for Secondary 5N(A).
- 8.2 Our students performed well in the 2021 GCE 'O' Level examination. For the Secondary 4 Express cohort, a total of 99.4% were eligible for Junior College or Polytechnic. A total of 33 students obtained an L1R5 aggregate of 10 and better. Two students achieved 7A1s and two other students achieved at least 6A1s. 16.7% of the students qualified for the Polytechnic Foundation Programme. For the 5N(A) cohort, the percentage eligible for Polytechnic was 72%.



8.3 The following efforts were made by the staff to improve teaching and learning in the school:

a. <u>Lesson Design and Teaching Packages</u>

i. To better integrate ICT in 2021, teachers continued to work in teams to develop detailed Blended Learning lesson packages across all subjects and implemented them during Home-Based Learning/Tech Goodness It's Friday. In 2022, teachers explored various approaches to teaching and learning in Professional Learning Circle (PLC) teams and developed teaching packages based on each PLC's area of research.

b. Integration of ICT - Student Learning Space (SLS)

 To support Assessment for Learning, Home-Based Learning and Blended Learning, the school continues its efforts at integrating the use of SLS and other useful online applications in teaching and learning.

c. ALP - Design Engineering

- Students built a programmable Arduino Car in the Applied Learning Programme (ALP). The school has infused Design Thinking skills and critical thinking into the ALP curriculum.
- ii. ALP for Secondary 2 classes commenced in Term 1, Week 2 and ran for 1 hour weekly, for over one semester. Classes for the Secondary 1 cohort began in Term 3, Week 1.
- iii. Students were taught how to create virtual circuits, block programming and how to use sensors like Bluetooth, InfraRed and ultrasound.

d. <u>LLP - Sports for Life</u>

- Our LLP, 'Sports for Life', inculcates life skills and values of servant leadership in our boys, while encouraging them to lead an active lifestyle. The programme helps to develop WISE & TRUE values within the boys to serve family, society and eternity.
- ii. Through LLP, boys learn the Play³ values (i.e. Play Hard, Play Safe, Play Fair). Values in Action projects are carried out to promote active living.
- iii. Alongside other sports, rugby is taught at all levels, and serves as a vehicle to develop life skills. The boys are also taught to serve as ambassadors for rugby and of healthy living. In addition, a leadership programme is put in place to develop our Sports Leaders.
- iv. The PE curriculum develops a range of sports competencies, including injury management, sports nutrition, and sports safety.

e. English Language and Literature

- i. The SAINTS Read programme, which aims to nurture students' media literacy and honing their critical thinking (CT) skills, is being implemented for the fourth year. Teachers curate a set of articles on a weekly basis, covering a broad range of topics to expand students' worldview. Each set of articles is supplemented with CT questions to teach students the skills of considering the target audience, detecting bias and questioning the purpose of each article.
- ii. To expand their worldview and literary appreciation, our Literature curriculum



- exposes our boys to a mix of local and international works, as well as classics and contemporary texts. We have developed and annually updated our poetry anthology to include texts from a range of themes, countries and time periods.
- iii. A range of strategies, such as the 'denotation-connotation' critical questioning framework, gamification, free-writing and creative writing, enable our boys to develop their personal voice on issues in the literary texts they study.
- iv. The EL programme centres around themes that help our students make sense of the world and issues around them. Through the themes and related activities, we hope to get our students to find their voice and express their thoughts. For example, the recurrent theme of "Food" in the Secondary One, Two and Three levels enables the boys to explore food and its immediate impact on their lives, on the lives of our community and our culture. In Sec 1, the students create food vlogs turning into amateur Master Chefs who whip up their favourite dish. In Sec 2, they review the food around the Potong Pasir neighbourhood and think about quality, quantity and the nutritional value. In Sec 3, our students visit the wet markets in Singapore to understand its cultural significance to us. They interview patrons and hawkers to gain a deeper understanding of its importance to our culture and society.

f. Mother Tongue Languages (MTL)

- Secondary 2 Chinese Language students participated in a workshop where they learnt Chinese Martial Arts as part of the Mother Tongue Fortnight Programme. They learnt a combination of movements employing their fists and a fan.
- ii. Secondary 1, 2 and 3 Malay Language students participated in a workshop where they learnt Silat as part of the Mother Tongue Fortnight program. Silat traces its origin to the early days of Malay civilisation and has since developed into a tradition of physical and spiritual training that embodies aspects of traditional Malay attire, performing arts and culture.
- iii. Secondary 1, 2 and 3 Tamil Language students participated in a workshop where they were introduced to one of the oldest traditional Indian Martial Arts, Silambaattam, as part of the Mother Tongue Fortnight program. Silambaattam is an ancient weapon-based martial art, with the word "Silam" meaning "hills" and "Kambu" meaning sticks.
- iv. Secondary 2 Tamil Language students participated in the Tamil Language Festival organised by Umar Pulavar Tamil Language Centre.
- v. Secondary 2 and 3 Tamil Language students participated in the Naanum Oru Padaipaali writing competition by the Ministry of Education.
- vi. Secondary 3 Malay Language students won gold medals at the National Malay Essay Writing Contest organised by Edn Media.



- vii. Secondary 3 Malay Language students participated in the Fiesta Kesantunan competition organised by the Malay Language Learning Promotion Committee.
- viii. Secondary 2 Malay Language students participated in the 3T Translation competition organised by National Junior College.
- ix. Secondary 1, 2 and 3 Higher Chinese students participated in the National Secondary Schools Translation Competition.
- x. Secondary 1 and 2 Malay Language boys participated in a Dikir Barat workshop as part of an Arts & Culture Day programme organised by the school.
- xi. Secondary 1 and 2 Tamil Language students participated in a workshop where they learnt to play various traditional musical instruments, as part of an Arts & Culture Day programme organised by the school.
- xii. 39 Secondary 1, 2 and 3 Chinese Language students participated in a music camp as part of the National Schools Xinyao Festival 2022. Students learnt about how to write lyrics for Chinese songs and attended a performance by a team of musicians from Xin Kong Xia, as part of the Arts & Culture Day. A group of 25 Secondary 1, 2 and 3 Chinese Language students participated in a music competition including criteria such as the writing of lyrics and song composition.
- xiii. 80 Chinese Language students across all 4 levels participated in the National Chinese Challenge organised by Zaobao and Nanyang Girls' High School.
- xiv. The MTL teachers use a thematic approach in lessons to enhance various skills such as writing, comprehension and communication. They apply various strategies such as the 6 Thinking Hats, Critical Thinking, Making Thinking Visible and Differentiated Instruction to cater to students' varied abilities in the learning of Mother Tongue Languages.
- xv. To broaden their worldview, the students are introduced to various forms of reading materials such as short stories, novels, newspaper articles and poems.
- xvi. The department uses a wide array of ICT platforms, such as Student Learning Space, Google Classroom, Kahoot, Padlet, Quizzlet, Nearpod, Quizze and Canva to support and enthuse students' learning of Mother Tongue Languages.

g. Mathematics

- i. To enrich students' understanding and application of Mathematics, our boys participated in competitions, such as the Singapore Mathematics Olympiad.
- ii. Students from the Upper Secondary Normal Academic (NA) and Normal Technical (NT) streams and the Lower Secondary Normal Technical (NT) stream participated in the 2021 All Singapore Secondary Mathematics Competition for Normal Course Students organised by Clementi Town

Secondary School. The competition is a national-level online Mathematics competition to enrich students' knowledge and stimulate greater interest in Mathematics.

h. Science

- i. To nurture a strong interest and cultivate enthusiasm in Science, students participate in a range of activities and competitions that provide an avenue for them to showcase their abilities and nurture their talent in the Sciences.
- ii. Three Secondary 2 students formed a group and took part in the STEM SHELL Nxplorers 2022, where they constructed solutions to the challenges on Water and Energy from Jan 2022 to August 2022.
- iii. A total of 13 students from 4SA and 4SB participated in the Singapore Junior Physics Olympiad (SJPO) general round on Jun 2022.
- iv. Two teams consisting of a total of six boys participated in the Innovation Programme from Jan to Aug 2022.
- v. Nine boys participated in the Singapore Junior Biology Olympiad in May 2022 and seven received either a silver, bronze or an honourable mention for their participation.
- vi. 19 students represented our school at the International Biomedical Quiz organised by Anglo-Chinese Junior College and the Mathematics Council. It provided a platform for students to develop their aptitude and potential in the biomedical disciplines through independent work and the application of critical thinking skills to solve authentic medical challenges. 10 students placed among the top 40% of the competition.
- vii. Four teams participated in the annual IgNITE Skills Challenge. The competition aims to introduce students to technical skills and foster a deeper understanding of courses offered by ITE. All four teams successfully placed among the top ten teams of each challenge.
- viii. Two teams, comprising 3 members each, took part in the Singapore Science and Engineering Festival 2022. Both teams were also shortlisted for final judging.

i. Humanities

- i. The Humanities Department facilitates experiential learning and infuses critical thinking skills to enable our boys to interpret various historical, environmental, and social phenomena.
- ii. Inquiry-based learning via Historical and Geographical Investigation programmes is implemented as a key pedagogical approach, to encourage the development of critical thinking and problem-solving skills. Visible thinking strategies (e.g. mind maps and graphic organisers) are employed to help students make connections between ideas and aid information recall and consolidation.
- iii. In support of the 2022 St Andrew's Junior College's MUN Conference, 'Peace for the People',' 15 of our students signed up as delegates. By role-playing as ambassadors of different countries, they were immersed in experiential learning that aimed to deepen their understanding of global issues and hone their skills in diplomacy. Ho Kok Hou, Michael, received an award for



- Outstanding Delegate, Shridhar Raj received an award for Best Position Paper and T Shridhar and Mark Tan Jia Ren were given Honourable Mention.
- iv. A group of four Secondary 4 students were selected for the annual NUS Geography Challenge. The Challenge aims to ignite students' passion and interest for the dynamic discipline of Geography through intellectually stimulating, creative and fun platforms. Through the competition, students apply geographical knowledge that they have learnt in school and gain exposure to other sub-fields of the discipline. Two of our boys Lim Jun Yu, 4SA and Chua Shao Wen, Josh 4S1 received the Bronze award for commendable individual performance.
- v. On 22 April, a group of 10 Secondary 3 Geography students attended the ASEAN Symposium for Secondary School Students. The Symposium is a platform for secondary school students, policy makers and academic representatives to discuss modern issues concerning ASEAN. It provides our students with the opportunity to research and gain insights into the complexities and intricacies of pertinent ASEAN-related issues in the societal, economic, cultural, environmental and political domains, beyond what is covered in the secondary school Humanities curriculum. At the second session on 15 Jul, our students had the opportunity to present their views on the challenge of climate change and discuss solutions for how to address it.
- vi. The Geography Unit hosted a dialogue session with the Geography Unit of the Curriculum Planning and Development Division on 28 Apr, Thurs. The session involved a dialogue with the Head of Department (Humanities), the Geography Team and a focus group discussion with six upper secondary Geography students offering elective and full Geography.
- vii. The MOE Educational Technology Division collaborated with our Social Studies Unit to develop a video showcasing the application of e-Pedagogy in the classroom.

j. Aesthetics & Design

- The Aesthetics & Design Department aims to develop students' creativity, cultural awareness, critical thinking and empathy by exposing them to a range of Music, Art and Design from across history and the world.
- ii. Parents are engaged in the department's efforts to instil a deep appreciation for the subject. The Art and D&T teachers held a ZOOM conference with the parents of Secondary 4 & 5 Art and D&T students, to communicate expectations and the timeline for coursework. During the session, they also shared various strategies to motivate and instil resilience in our students.
- iii. Performance opportunities, workshops and participation in competitions enable our students to demonstrate their skills and talents, and allow them to develop confidence and passion for the subjects. The D&T and FCE units organised internal competitions for Lower Secondary students to recognise students' efforts and potential in projects that they embarked on. The Music unit organised a concert, Vivace, showcasing performances from the Upper Secondary Music students as well as other musical talents in school. The concert saw a full turnout comprising staff, family and friends in the Auditorium.
- iv. In November 2021, the Enhanced Art Programme (EAP) students participated



- in a 3-day iLeap programme, which saw them learning, designing and creating 2D and 3D works with artist-mentors from the creative industry.
- v. In Jan, the current Sec Three EAP students embarked on a Milestone Learning Journey via Zoom where they learnt from industry professionals from various fields, such as motion graphics and industrial design.
- vi. In March, the Music students engaged in learning experiences that deepened their appreciation for cultural music. The Music Unit organised a Zapin workshop where instructors of traditional Malay music taught the O and N(T)-level music students the cultural music form. In addition, the Music unit partnered a Parent Volunteer to organise a mini concert put up by one of the pop bands from LASALLE College of the Arts, held in our music room. Besides learning more about pop music and music in the local scene, the students got to interact with an SASS alumnus, Mr Puvnaram, who was also the electric quitarist of the band.
- vii. In April, the Sec Four EAP students visited the National Gallery and viewed traditional and contemporary art by prominent local and South-East Asian artists.
- viii. On 1 & 2 Jun, our Secondary 3 Nutrition and Food Science students attended a Food Experiment workshop conducted by Mr Patrick Austin from Salt and Loves. In this workshop, the boys conducted food experiments and learned other culinary skills such as baking, frying, steaming, and piping of fillings into tarts.
- ix. In Jul, the Sec Three EAP students visited Nan Chiau High's EAP Art Exhibition, titled One HeART. They will also be embarking on in-house docent training sessions for the Saints Art Gallery.

k. Information and Communications Technology (ICT)

- i. All Secondary 1 to 3 students collected their PLDs during the unboxing day on 25 Oct 2021. All students were issued a school-managed Apple ID to login to their iPads. This ID allows students to access 200 GB via iCloud storage during their years in the school.
- ii. All teaching staff also received their iPads. Training was conducted to equip staff with the skills to apply the various iPad functions during their lessons. The training was delivered according to three level of competencies (basic, intermediate and advanced), based on staff feedback on their learning needs regarding the iPad.
- Secondary 1 parents and students were briefed on the National Digital Literacy Programme in Jan 2022. All Secondary 1 students received their PLDs on 30 Mar 2022.
- iv. Three teachers (HOD/ICT Mdm Josephine Phua, Ms Sim Jing Ting and Mr Caleb Cheong) attended the Apple Learning Leader course conducted by Apple Learning Institute, Singapore in Nov 2021 and Jun 2022.
- v. The ICT department has administered the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) 2022 Main Study for 30 students on 5 Apr 2022. PISA is an important educational research project investigating student literacy in mathematics, science and reading every three years.

vi. The ICT department has conducted 3 ETPD training sessions in Semester 1 to equip staff with knowledge of how to use Apple TV and various iPad apps.

I. Character and Citizenship Education

- i. The Social Skills curriculum has been implemented for the fifth year. Our boys learnt sets of behaviour that enable them to interact with one another in ways that are personally enriching, mutually beneficial and beneficial to others. The aim is to positively shape students' behaviour and strengthen their resilience.
- ii. The peer support curriculum has been implemented for the third year. This programme aims to raise our students' awareness and sensitivity to their peers' needs. Our boys have learnt to relate better to peers, be empathetic towards their peers and help to watch out for their peers on signs of distress.
- iii. The CCE curriculum has incorporated modules on mental well-being for all students. The school has also organised assembly talks on mental well-being.
- iv. On Jan 17, the Lower Secondary students attended a virtual Chingay 2022 National Education Assembly Programme.
- v. Over 4 days in Jan, Sec 2 students went on their Cohort Learning Journey to the National Museum. The purpose is to create a common experience learning about Singapore's history, so as to strengthen students' sense of belonging to Singapore.
- vi. On May 18, Sec 2 WISE classes went on their Cohort Learning Journey to the Maritime Museum. This was a collaboration between the National Education Committee and the Lower Secondary History Unit.
- vii. On Jun 27, Sec 4 and 5 students attended the NS Engagement Session facilitated by Singapore Discovery Centre Ltd. Senior Lieutenant Colonel (NS) Darren Tan from Mindef Nexus, a St Andrew's School alumnus, was the invited speaker for the session.

m. Physical Education

- i. A structured sports module was implemented during PE lessons for all students. The module included sports skills acquisition and games modified for small-group participation. Games conducted included tag rugby and frisbee for Secondary 1 students, badminton and football for Secondary 2 students, floorball and volleyball for Secondary 3 students and tag rugby for Secondary 4 and 5 students. The students tested their sporting skills against their peers during the annual interclass games.
- ii. In-person PE modules have resumed in 2022 due to the easing of the COVID-19 situation. Students were able to learn skills and concepts via the games played, as well as maintain their health and fitness levels.
- iii. The structured SwimSafer programme was enhanced to include a module on life-saving skills and long-distance swimming for more proficient swimmers or for swimmers who have completed the SwimSafer certification. The certification from the programme is recognised on a national level. The SwimSafer 2.0 course was conducted for Secondary 2 students in Term 1 and 2
- iv. NAPFA Week will resume in Term 3 for Secondary 2 students. To prepare our students and support their well-being, various fitness components of the test



- were incorporated into the curriculum for PE lessons.
- v. The School's Cross Country Event was replaced with an online Virtual Run where students could complete the distances of 3.5km (Lower Secondary) or 5km (Upper Secondary) at their own time within a 4-week window. The top 20 participants from each level were recognised with medals.

n. Academic Support Structures

To prepare students for the Weighted Assessments and upcoming National Examinations, these programmes were continued in 2022:

- i. Structured Remedial Programmes (Term 1) for Secondary 1 to 3 students were conducted from 7 Feb, Mon to 13 May, Fri.
- ii. Intensive Revision for Mother Tongue Languages was conducted for graduating students from 19 May, Thur to 26 May, Thur.
- iii. Extended curriculum was conducted for graduating classes during these respective periods:
 - Sec 4NA/NT 31 May, Tues to 2 Jun, Fri
 - Sec 4E/5NA 31 May, Tues to 6 Jun, Mon

- 8.4 At the 83rd Prefects' Commendation Service on 28 Jan 2022, a total of 21 School Prefects and 8 Senior Prefects were officially appointed and began serving in their roles as prefects and servant leaders of the school.
- 8.5 The following programmes were carried out to foster greater student leadership across levels, CCAs and programmes:
 - a) The Prefectorial Board organised an Appreciation Day for Non-Teaching Staff in August 2021.
 - b) The Prefectorial Board organised a Virtual Concert for the Teachers' Day Celebration in September 2021.
 - c) A Cleaners Appreciation week was organised from 28 Feb 2022 to 4 March 2022.
 - d) An outdoor leadership challenge activity was organised for the Secondary Three and Secondary Four Prefects.
 - e) The School Prefects attended the ChrySAlis Workshop organised by St Andrew's Junior College.
 - f) Secondary One Junior Leaders, Secondary Two Junior Prefects, and Secondary Three School Prefects attended a Training and Development Programme on 22 Jun 2022.
 - g) Selected members of the Prefectorial Board attended a Parliament Seating on 4 Jul 2022.
 - h) As part of the inaugural Youth Inclusivity Challenge, Secondary Two Junior Prefects conducted an inclusivity campaign during the month of Jul 2022.
 - i) Youth Day Appeal was held from 18 Jul to 22 Jul in 2022. The annual Appeal is organised by the Community Chest to collect donations that will be used to empower students with special needs. The donation drive this year was managed by Secondary 2 Junior Prefects and Secondary 3 Prefects.



- 8.6 Our students were given the following opportunities to serve the community:
 - a) Students from Secondary One and Four classes worked on promoting the 3Rs (Reduce, Reuse and Recycle) in school during the annual Green Carnival. Through their sharing of environmental issues and good practices, they aimed to raise awareness of how students can contribute to sustainability.
 - b) Students from Secondary Two worked on short videos promoting physical and mental wellbeing for the whole school.
 - c) Students from Secondary 3 classes were given a choice of VIA projects. Some students collaborated with Vintage Radio to bring music to the elderly, while others worked with SOLES4SOULS to collect old shoes in wearable condition for donation to the less fortunate. Other students brought the elderly residents of Kwong Wai Shui Nursing Home for walks at the nearby parks.
 - d) Students from the Secondary 3 Normal (Academic) stream organised a Non-Teaching Staff Appreciation Day, where they applied their knowledge from the Life Skills Programme. Students honoured our cleaning and administrative staff by applying their culinary, fitness and website design skills and by making hand-crafted gifts.
- 8.7 The following efforts were carried out to support students and instil a greater sense of belonging:
 - a) The new academic year commenced on Tuesday, 4 Jan 2022. As per past years' tradition, boys from the Junior School undertook the 'Crossover' to symbolise their graduation to the Secondary School. This year the boys were flagged off class by class due to Safe Distancing Measures, with the rest of the school watching them in their classrooms via live-stream.
 - b) The school planned activities for all students in conjunction with Saints Development Day, which was held from 5 Jan to 6 Jan 2022. The Secondary 1 students participated in Team Bonding and Leadership activities and attended a workshop on Personal Grooming and Social Etiquette during their Orientation Camp. The CCA Display Day was spread out over 3 afternoons due to COVID-19 restrictions. The Secondary 2 students were involved in the Mother Tongue Language Programme and the Arts and Design Festival. The Secondary 3 students took part in StrengthsFinder Profiling and Team Building activities. Our Secondary 4 and 5 students were involved in a Motivational Study Skills Workshop as well as Team Bonding activities
 - c) Interclass Games were organised for Secondary 1 to 5 students over the course of Term 1 Week 10. The games organised were tag rugby for Sec 1, 4 and 5 classes, badminton for Secondary 2 classes and floorball for Secondary 3 classes.
- 8.8 The school supported the development of students' character and life skills as follows:
 - a) For the Youth Engagement Programme for Saints (YEPS) 2022, the Discipline department organised enrichment programmes to enhance students' motivation for learning, strengthen their connectedness to school and build their resilience. Selected students who took part in the programme in March to April 2022 were taught skills such as goal-setting, time-management, and social emotional learning competencies. Education and career guidance sessions were held for students to understand, and unearth their goals and interests.



- b) Workshops were conducted to prepare students who were keen to apply for DSA, ITE EAE and Poly EAE. They include the ITE EAE Workshop held on 12 April 2022 and the Poly EAE Write-Up Workshop was conducted on 26 April 2022. Students who were shortlisted for interviews had individual 1-1 sessions with our ECG Counsellor Ms Nurkhadijah.
- c) The StrengthsFinder workshop was conducted for Secondary 3 students in two parts, one in Term 1 and the second in Term 3. Secondary 1 students visited the Lorong Halus Wetland and Gardens by the Bay to learn more about water management, conservation and sustainability on 23 May 2022. Secondary 2 students went to various Singapore Farms in Term 2 to learn about food security and sustainability on 7 March 2022.
- d) Elective Modules were arranged to expose students to possible educational progression and career pathways, thereby enabling them to make more informed choices upon graduation. The Sec 2 and 3 N students participated in the 30-hour Cat A and B EM, while the Sec 3 E and N (A) students participated in the Advanced Elective Module (AEM) in Semester 1.
- 8.9 The following achievements were made by students at national events or competitions:

a) International Biomedical Quiz, 2021

1.1 11th International Biomedical Quiz

19 students represented our school at the 11th International Biomedical Quiz organised by Anglo Chinese Junior College and the Mathematics Council.
